Flynns Design ANZAC Centenary Pin



Kyneton's renowned artisans Flynn's Silver have designed and produced the presentation pin for major donors to the ANZAC Centenary Public Fund.

When designing this important historical piece Dan Flynn travelled to the Canberra war memorial to find the pine tree struck from seeds from the original "Lone Pine" planted by the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the republic of Turkey to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the Gallipoli landing. Fortuitously it was spring time and he sourced some beautiful baby pine cones that John Flynn has cast into precious metal.

As a mount for this cone the Flynn brothers sourced some 303 ammunition from WWI and replicated the size and engraving style. So now the Flynns had an original shell end with 4 15 C meaning it was loaded in April 1915 and the C for centenary with ANZAC the other side creating the finishing touch to a piece brimming with relevance and history. It will be proudly worn by any worthy recipient.

The Australian and New Zealand Prime Ministers, the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge and many heads of Australia's major companies have already received these pins. Many more will be gifted as fund raising for the Anzac centenary public fund continues.

Ambulatory Care Centre Starts

Construction of the long awaited Ambulatory Care Centre at the Kyneton Hospital site in Caroline Chisholm Drive has commenced.

In the first half of 2011 the former Federal Labor Government announced that Kyneton District Health Service had been successful in its application for a Federal grant of \$6.8M to build the Centre. Construction was expected to be completed in the second half of 2012.

After years of political wrangling the Premier turned the first sod at the site on June 3.


New Kyneton and District Health Service CEO Maree Cuddihy speaking on behalf of the Board and Kyneton Hospital staff, said all at the Service were very excited that construction was commencing.

The new building will replace the portable buildings currently offering GP and mental health services but will encompass many other services.

The Ambulatory Care Centre will accommodate Community Rehabilitation and Allied Health services, Community Nursing offices, Community Mental Health, General Practitioners, and Pathology.

There will also be a designated training and conference room that will accommodate up to 60 people, which will support recruitment and retention of the area's rural health workforce.

Peter Matthews, Board President said that construction was expected to be completed in about 12 months..

The report identifies opportunities for small-to-medium scale commercial development, but highlights the need for an air operations plan to regulate flight paths and times.

No Plans for KMI Lighting

Kyneton Connections has received a reply to its letter to the Council requesting improved external lighting as a matter of public safety near the entrances to the Kyneton Mechanics Institute.

The letter from CEO Peter Johnston indicated that Heritage Victoria approval would be required for such lights and at the present time there were no plans to install additional lighting.

over 1000 people participated in the online survey about what you feel makes the Macedon Ranges special.

The State government has promised to update our local planning statement of protection, currently known as SPP8, which was written in 1974.

Council officers have been busy collating your responses to produce a draft document for further community comment.

This will be coming out soon, so watch out for advertisements in the paper, and "Have your say" on council's website to see if the draft reflects what you want protected within the shire.

It should be in an easy to read format, with associated maps, clearly outlining the areas of the Shire we wish to have recognised and protected at a State level, and how this can be achieved.

Also on public display, at council offices, and the website (under Have your say), are

1) Amendment C89. This is about land rezoning and heritage overlays, and some addresses include the Kyneton district. Submissions are due by 30th June.

2) Kyneton Airfield analysis: A consultant's report on possible economic benefits of the airfield, an opportunity to be heard on what you think of their comments, and any other thoughts you have about the future of the airfield. Due 27th June

And finally, an opportunity to state your thoughts on an application by the community looking for a listing of Hanging Rock, for inclusion in the Victorian Heritage Register, due by 22nd July, which is available on website www.dpcd.vic.gov.au/heritage/victorian-heritage-register/registration/current-recommendations-open-for-comment

Education Future Considered

It is a question that was visited in the 1980s and again in the years of the decade previous to this – should state primary school education for the children of this district be offered from the small Baynton St site or move to the much larger preserved site in Edgcombe St?

In the 1980s the community opted for refurbishment and addition to the Baynton St site.

Last decade the community's choice was to move to Edgcombe St as part of a broader vision which was named the Kyneton Education Plan (KEP) but although, after a lengthy consultation process a master plan was prepared, neither side of politics committed funding to construction.

The KEP envisaged the construction of an Education precinct, almost entirely new buildings spanning the Edgcombe St site and the adjacent Kyneton Secondary College site.

It was to encompass Kindergarten and junior primary facilities fronting Edgcombe St, middle years facilities bridging senior primary and junior secondary classes on the nearest parts of the Secondary College property and senior secondary facilities based around the original historic buildings.

The advantages of such an arrangement were seen as construction of learning spaces fitting 21st century learning and technology, shared facilities such as science and art rooms and enhanced integration of learning programs across primary and secondary.

With the State election imminent both sides of politics are now addressing provision of government education for Kyneton and District with candidates Mary-Anne Thomas (Labor) and Donna Petrovich (Liberal) and their respective leaders and front benchers placing policies before the local community.

The first word came from Labor Leader Daniel Andrews who

announced at the Edgcombe St site that Labor was committing to construction of a new Primary School at that site at cost of \$11.5M.

"Labor's commitment of \$11.5M is an important first step in providing the 21st century learning environments Kyneton and surrounding communities need, now and into the future" Labor candidate Mary-Anne Thomas said.

Soon after Premier Denis Napthine visited both schools and pledged \$5.3M in capital grants funding to improve facilities at Kyneton Secondary College and \$3.5M in government funding to either improve school facilities at the current Baynton St site or to support relocation to the Kyneton Secondary College (Edgcombe St) site.

Both allocations were included in the recent May 2014 State budget and forward estimates.

"The Premier has made it clear that it is entirely up to the school community to decide its preference (Baynton St or Edgcombe St) and that in the case of a preference for relocation, more funding will be provided" Liberal candidate Donna Petrovich said.

On May 30 Daniel Andrews again came to Kyneton and pledged that the \$11.5M to relocate Kyneton Primary School would, if Labor were elected, be in its first budget.

Kyneton Secondary College has welcomed the \$5.3 M for upgrade works allocated in the May budget and has commenced planning on how it will use the money.

Kyneton Primary School commenced its community consultation to assist its School Council decision as to whether to relocate to Edgcombe St or remain at the current site at a very well attended meeting on Monday June 16.

With 5 months remaining to the State election we are bound to hear much more about education provision for the children, current and future, of Kyneton and District.
