



OKPS update issued



On Apr 2 Creative Victoria issued an update on the progress of works at the Old Kyneton Primary School. The local community and the Council have been anxious to receive such a report.

The report stated:

“Construction of the new gallery and events space at Old Kyneton Primary School, funded by the Victorian Government, was completed last year with minor defects work still underway.

“Creative Victoria is working through operating arrangements and the plan to open the new spaces.

“The works have been complex given the historic nature of the site and the significant deterioration of the buildings, but the result means this local icon will be returned to community use as a safe, vibrant and unique space to gather for exhibitions and indoor and outdoor events”.

The Victorian Government’s \$12 million investment in the site includes: the transformation of the bluestone building into a multi-purpose gallery and events space; landscaping across the whole site and minor works to make the rest of the 1980s building stable and secure until decisions are made about future works to this section.

“Creative Victoria is working to finalise the arrangements for operation of the new spaces that were delivered in phase one of project, whilst the approach to completing the phase 2 works on the 1980s building is being finalised. Details will be shared with the community as soon as possible” the Update said.

Opening Children’s Hub

A big crowd attended the grand opening of the Kyneton Community House Children’s Hub on Sat Mar 22 to celebrate the hard work put in by KCH Staff, Volunteers & families to bring the Hutton St site, formerly Lady Brooks Kindergarten back to life.

Councillors amend Kyneton Framework

At its March 26 meeting the Macedon Ranges Shire Council adopted the Kyneton Urban Design Framework 2025 but with significant amendments which were moved by Cr Kate Kendall and seconded by Cr Janet Pearce and passed unanimously. The changes were

- Removal of proposed kerb outstands at the: south-east corner of Market St/ Mollison St and the west corners of Yaldwyn St West/Mollison St.
- Undertaking community consultation for the final detailed design of the Mollison St/Piper St intersection, to ensure appropriate traffic movements.
- Design kerb outstands in Piper St to ensure the heritage appearance of the street is maintained.
- Implementing a kerb outstand trial on a Mollison St intersection.
- The recommended speed limit be modified to a minimum of 40kph.

The Kyneton UDF is a strategic plan for public realm improvements in Kyneton’s commercial area.

One Councillor commented “Kyneton is not really inner city Melbourne, it’s not Brunswick”.

The UDF aims to enhance the appearance, amenity, and functionality of the town centre through various projects, such as safety improvements, upgrades to public spaces, and building design guidelines.

Council has stated that the community and other stakeholders will continue to be involved through engagement on the detailed design of key elements as they are implemented.

Dog Park at Velodrome



The State Minister for Environment Steve Dimopoulos and the Member for Macedon Mary-Anne Thomas have announced that as part of Round two of the New and Upgraded Dog Parks Program Macedon Ranges Shire Council submitted one of a 29 successful Dog Park applications and will receive \$99,000 for Hurry Reserve (Kyneton Velodrome).

This project aims to enhance accessibility and amenities for park users and their dogs at Hurry Reserve by creating designated spaces for quiet and active dogs.

Key upgrades include upgrading fencing and pathways, adding new shelters and seating, installing gates, signage and waste disposal solutions.

The design of the park will follow community consultation.

Construction is expected to be completed on all projects by the end 2026.

Football Update

After it seemed that the newly formed Kyneton Women's Football Club, formerly part of the Kyneton Football Netball Club may not have a competition to play in for 2025 they have come together with Gisborne Football Netball Club to form a hybrid Gisborne Kyneton United Team for 2025 to compete in the Essendon District Football League.

This partnership will last for the 2025 EDFL season, with the Kyneton Women's Football Club planning to reapply for the Riddell District Football Netball League in 2026.

The Kyneton Football Netball Club teams commenced their season in the RDFNL on Sat Apr 5 playing new team to the League, the Gisborne Giants at New Gisborne.

In that match the Kyneton Mens Senior Football defeated the Gisborne Giants 141 pts to 31 pts.

Federal Election May 3

The Federal election will be held on Sat May 3.

Kyneton and district is in the Seat of Bendigo. Applications for postal ballots have already opened.

At the time of *Kyneton Connect* going to the printer candidate nominations had not closed nor had the locations of polling booths and early voting centres been announced.

On election day booths are open 8am-6pm. Pre-poll voting at Early Voting Centres will commence from Apr 22.

Creative project boost

Students at Kyneton Primary School will turn learning into an art form this year thanks to the latest round of grants through the Victorian Government's Creative Learning Partnerships program. Member for Macedon Mary-Anne Thomas has announced a \$35,000 grant to Kyneton Primary School through the long running program which supports schools to work with local artists, creative collectives and arts companies on residency projects that will supercharge the curriculum in new, creative ways.

The project will see Kyneton students collaborate with artists from Threshold on a creative exploration of the life cycle, reflecting on nature, growth and change through theatre, music and art creation.

Birthing kit working bee

While most Australian women can look forward to the safe arrival of a new baby, this is not the case in many parts of the developing world, where rates of maternal and infant mortality are unacceptably high.

According to the World Health Organisation, worldwide, about 800 women die every day from the complications of childbirth.

The Zonta Club of Kyneton will help to reduce these tragic deaths by assembling 800 birthing kits at a public working bee in St Mary's Church Hall, Hutton St on Sat May 17 from 10:30 am.

Broader consultation on intersection

The Council has advised Kyneton Connections, publishers of *Kyneton Connect*, that Council officers are revisiting their proposed changes to Beauchamp-Mollison St intersection.

The proposed design includes outstands on the western kerb of the intersection which would prevent vehicles travelling northwards along Mollison from passing on the left of vehicles waiting to turn right into Beauchamp. The design also includes a pedestrian crossing of Beauchamp St near the east side of the intersection as a means of slowing traffic even though few pedestrians cross Beauchamp St there.

Many in the community have advocated a reduction of the current speed limit of 60kph at the intersection and Council has advised that Council officers are working with the Department of Transport and Planning as the responsible authority for speed limit approvals to explore potential speed reductions in Kyneton.

The Council has also advised following feedback from the community about its proposed changes to the Jennings St-Mollison St intersection Council officers are revisiting the design.

The Council has also committed to broader community consultation on the design of both intersections.

Kyneton Connections President Eric Dearth welcomed the commitment to broader community consultation commenting that although both intersections are used by the majority of Kyneton residents few were aware of the details of the proposed changes until they were almost a fait accompli.

Kyneton Aero Club set to soar



On Mar 4 Lisa Chesters MHR for Bendigo visited Kyneton Airfield to announce that the Federal Labor Government is investing \$413,500 for upgrades at the Airfield.

Funded under Round 4 of the Regional Airports Program, Kyneton is one of nine airports across Victoria that will share in \$4.5m of funding.

The project will include the extension and resealing of the runway, as well as sealing taxiways, increasing tarmac area around the refuelling bay and the installation of a dedicated helipad for emergency services rotary aircraft.

Extending the runway will accommodate larger aircraft used for aeromedical flights and fire-fighting operations, improving safety, operational efficiency and emergency response capabilities at the airfield.

Sealing the taxiway will help to prevent damage to aircraft and will make the airport operational in all weather conditions.

The total project will cost \$827,000, with the Kyneton Aero Club matching the Federal Government's grant with a \$413,500 contribution.

Airports are vital for regional communities, providing critical access to emergency healthcare, as well as commerce, industry, tourism and education.

"With the \$413,500 grant, we're excited to transform our airfield into a safer and more efficient space for the vital aero-medical and fire services that keep our community protected." the Aero Club's Sophia Eldridge said.

"This keeps Kyneton residents safer and makes the region more resilient in the face of natural disasters" Federal Member Lisa Chesters said.

West Ward Councillors Update

Events and festivals are such an important part of the Macedon Ranges and at our March Council meeting we endorsed the guidelines for the 2025/26 Events and Festivals Grant Program, which open 28 April. If your group is thinking of applying, please contact staff as early as possible to discuss.

Also at this March meeting we endorsed the Kyneton Urban Design Framework. This document is a guideline for the potential enhancement of Kyneton's streetscapes and public places mainly in Mollison, High and Piper Streets.

It has had three rounds of community consultation, and in response to this feedback, speed limits are recommended to only reduce to 40kph in some streets, an increased tree planting program, to explore options for uniformity of street furniture, along with trialling a curb outstand to see how it effects the flow of traffic and pedestrian safety in one location before considering others.

Most projects identified will require further community consultation to determine their final form. Thank you to all those who attended walk shops, drop in sessions, one on ones with planners, and provided written submissions and verbal feedback.

Speaking of community consultation, we held successful coffee catch ups at both Kyneton's Social Foundry and the Malmsbury Bakery in February and March.

Thanks to all who came along to say hello, provide feedback and ask questions.

Batters Lane funding

The Federal Black Spots Program targets dangerous road locations at increased risk of crash or collision, funding safety measures to improve road safety and help prevent serious injuries and deaths.

On Mar 22 Federal Member for Bendigo, Lisa Chesters visited the Batters Lane-Piper Creek Road intersection, which is receiving \$215,232 from the Federal Government to upgrade lighting and install new signage and a splitter island at the intersection.

Anyone is invited to nominate Black Spot locations, which are then considered annually by Black Spot Consultative Panels in each state and territory.

The Federal Government is progressively increasing the total investment to the Black Spots Program from \$110 million to \$150 million per year, meaning more money to improve the most dangerous sections of our roads.

Storages in good position despite hot dry summer

Coliban Water says the region's water resources remain in a good position despite a 25% jump in summer water consumption and lower water storage levels compared with last year.

Coliban Water spokesperson, Adam Cramer, said the dry conditions this summer had resulted in low inflows to the Upper Coliban, Lauriston and Malmsbury Reservoirs.

"91mm of rain fell at our Malmsbury Reservoir during the summer months, 33mm less than the long-term average.

"Low rainfall this past winter and spring, and dry ground in our catchments, has meant that just 531 megalitres flowed into our storages. That's around one third of what we'd typically expect at this time of year" Mr Cramer said.

"At the start of Autumn, our three reservoirs on the Coliban River were sitting at 61% capacity. At the same time last year, after a summer that was unusually wet, our storages were sitting at 86%."

Despite a drier summer this year, Mr Cramer said Coliban Water's good water resource position means customers would not see any water restrictions this year.

Croquet Club to the fore

It's been a busy time for the Kyneton Croquet Club.

The John Teed Club Championship was completed, with Darryl Chivers winning Division 1 on a countback of hoops, and Margaret Parker taking out Division 2.

On Mar 28, eight members of the Kyneton Croquet Club played Macedon Ranges Croquet Club for the much-loved Watts Fresh Trophy, the bi-annual competition between the two clubs for Shire croquet bragging rights.

Current trophy holders Kyneton prevailed 9 games to 7 in the closest result ever in this competition.

Kyneton also had entries in the Northern Districts Regional playoffs, with Damien Hadfield winning the top Division 1 slot undefeated.

Darryl Chivers came awfully close in Division 2, equal with the winner on games and hoops, but Quarry Hill's Bernie Lacey had beaten Darryl so got the representative slot.

A day in the life of a volunteer at the Preloved Pedlar

Robyn is a new resident to Kyneton and on one of her walks around the town she noticed a sign in a shop window seeking volunteers.

On her next walk past the Preloved Pedlar the door was open.

Robyn approached the counter and asked some questions.

The Day Manager greeted Robyn introducing herself.

Robyn explained she was new to town and with a little bit of experience in retail, felt she might be able to assist.

Following a chat and 'get to know you', Robyn completed the necessary forms and training and was welcomed as a volunteer.

Over the next weeks, Robyn learned about all that happens at the Preloved Pedlar. Out in the shed, which can only be described as an eclectic range of saleable items, she discovered a range of furniture, tools and much more.

This work is the first stage in re-developing the area where the old caretaker's house once stood with an improved entrance from the road, new plantings along the embankment, new picnic tables and seating.

Growing Healthy Communities grant



Kyneton High School will benefit from a \$50,000 VicHealth grant to Sunbury and Cobaw Community Health (SCCH), providing hands-on opportunities for students to grow, cook and share fresh fruit and vegetables from the school kitchen garden.
