2 The 2016 mentor program is also seeking experienced business professionals with a passion for mentoring for this program.

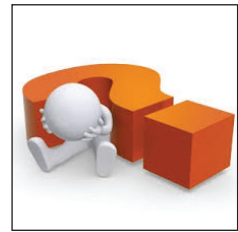
