

40kph limit for Kyneton?

The Macedon Ranges Shire Council is proposing to reduce the speed limit to 40 kph around the Kyneton township. This project is fully funded through the Victorian Government's Safe Local Roads and Streets Program, to improve road safety.

Full details of the streets affected can be found in the "Your Say" section of the Council Website under the heading "Pedestrian and Road Safety improvement".

"A township-wide speed limit reduction will greatly enhance safety for pedestrians, cyclists, and all road users, with studies showing that reducing speed limits has the potential to decrease fatalities by more than 50%".

"Slower speeds allow for better reaction times, helping drivers avoid accidents and ensuring greater safety for vulnerable road users" the Council says on its website.

The proposed speed reduction affects the core business/activity area and the residential areas nearby.

In addition to High, Mollison and Piper Sts some 23 other streets adjacent to those Streets are affected by the proposed speed limit reductions. All of Ebden St south of Piper St is included but surprisingly Beauchamp St is not included.

A map showing proposed speed limit reductions to streets around Kyneton can be found on the "Your Say" section of the MRSC Website.

Shaft rescue for labrador Ted



A team effort on June 2 saw local Trentham Fire Brigade members work with CFA's Oscar I rescue team to safely rescue a dog from an eight-metre-deep mine shaft.

Having wandered off from their owners' property on Thur May 29, Labradoodle Penny and Labrador Ted were found on Pronk Track in Trentham at around 11.43am on Mon Jun 2, with Penny above the mine and Ted sadly within it.

While extensive social media posts were placed online to help locate the dogs over the weekend, and hopeful sounds of barking were heard in the distance by neighbours, the pair were still unable to be located.

Trentham Fire Brigade Captain David Wheeldon said it wasn't until Jun 2 that the neighbours fortunately crossed paths with Penny and Ted on their walk and called 000.

"When we arrived, as you would expect, Penny was quite agitated, but luckily one of our firefighters knew the owners because they lived next door to them," David said.

"We were able to calm them down before Bendigo's Oscar I crew started the rescue process.

"Throughout the morning, we were providing Ted with plenty of food and water.

"The members of Oscar I descended down the 8m shaft to safely extricate Ted and hand him back into the arms of his owners at around 2.53pm, happy, healthy and well."

While on scene Trentham Fire Brigade members worked with Forest Fire Management Victoria to track their location with pink ribbon and red taped a number of open mine shafts nearby to reduce chances of future incidents.

South Kyneton Petition



Kyneton on Riverside, developers of the Estate on the south side of the Campaspe is encouraging local residents to sign a petition to authorities in support of improving connection and safety for those who live in Kyneton South through the construction of the bridge across the River at the bottom of Edgecombe Street and a shared path to the Railway station.

“As South Kyneton continues to grow, so does the need for safe, well-connected infrastructure. Yet two vital links remain incomplete: a shared pedestrian path to the train station, and a vehicle bridge across the Campaspe River from Edgecombe Street” a Kyneton on Riverside spokesperson said.

“Both are key to ensuring that residents—new and long-standing—can move around town safely and efficiently.

“Currently, there is no continuous footpath linking the new Kyneton South area to the Kyneton Railway Station—making it difficult for residents, particularly those on foot or with mobility needs, to safely access public transport.

“A 1.5-metre-wide footpath would make a meaningful difference, improving everyday safety and convenience.

“A previous proposal to include a shared path as part of the Kyneton on Riverside development has yet to move forward.

“A fresh look at pedestrian access, in collaboration with Council, VicTrack, and relevant stakeholders is needed.

“South Kyneton has just one entry/exit road connection—via Mollison Street—which means all traffic must pass through the centre of town.

“This contributes to congestion and adds pressure on the main thoroughfare.

“The proposed Edgecombe Street bridge would offer a much-needed second access point by connecting to High Street.

“It would ease traffic, improve safety, and create a more direct link to the school precinct.

“Council has acknowledged the importance of this connection in planning documents, and residents understand that funding is a major hurdle” the KOR spokesperson said.

Kyneton on Riverside stated that Macedon Ranges Shire Council continues to do valuable work in planning for Kyneton’s future but large-scale projects like these often require support from other levels of government and is calling on State and Federal representatives to partner with Council in delivering the Edgecombe Street bridge, the pedestrian pathway to Kyneton Station and to support safe, inclusive, and connected transport options for all.

A petition has been launched to seek action on these goals. Once it reaches 500 signatures, it will be presented to decision-makers at all levels.

Chesters vote up in Kyneton

Despite the surprise significant swings to the coalition candidate the National’s Andrew Lethlean around Bendigo in the May 3 Federal election, there were small two Party preferred swings to Labor candidate Lisa Chesters at Kyneton booths. Castlemaine also supported Chesters strongly.

Lisa Chesters final margin was 2983. She gained 51.4% of Bendigo’s 2 party preferred vote. She had 2pp votes of 65.3% at Kyneton, 60% at Kyneton East and 64.3% at Malmsbury.

It's been great to see some rain providing a little bit of relief for our region.

In this issue, we have much to report. Council has recently launched community consultations relating to proposed speed limit reductions across three of our major towns, including Kyneton.

These proposals have been informed by earlier planning work and consultation, such as through the Kyneton Movement Network Plan and its objectives, and aim to improve safety for all road users, including drivers and pedestrians.

The community can leave feedback on the survey until Mon July 7, and there is a drop-in session specific for the Kyneton proposal on Tues July 1 from 5:30-7pm at Council's Kyneton Administration Centre 129 Mollison St. You can find out more and have your say by visiting the Your Say section of the Council Website.

You might have received an update about the Kyneton Flood Study.

The North Central Catchment Management Authority (NCCMA), which is the authority responsible for determining flood risk for the northern region of the Shire, has recently revised and updated its flood risk mapping for the areas of Kyneton, Carlsruhe, Malmsbury, Lauriston and Tylden.

The updated mapping incorporates the latest recommended climate change considerations for flood estimation and builds upon the existing work of the Kyneton Flood Study 2019 and Rapid Flood Risk Assessments 2020.

continue its membership in a Visitor Economy Partnership (VEP) as it transitions from Daylesford Macedon Tourism (DMT) to Destination Central Victoria Inc. (DCV).

DCV will support tourism businesses and be a lead for visitor attraction to the region, covering the areas of Macedon Ranges, Hepburn, Central Goldfields and Mount Alexander Shires. Local businesses will be able to join as partners to receive membership support and benefits.

Following Council's recent Federal Election advocacy and the bipartisan support we received to help fund upgrades to the Kyneton Skatepark, funding was allocated in the proposed Draft Budget 2025-26 towards progressing consultation, detailed design and documentation for the project.

Project planning work is estimated to be completed in 2025-26, with the upgrade delivered from 2026-27 onwards.

Finally, don't forget to check out the new exhibition at Kyneton Museum, produced in collaboration with sporting clubs and historical societies in the Shire - 'Good Sports, Leisure and Recreation in the Macedon Ranges'.

The Museum is open 11 am to 4 pm Fri to Sun, and the exhibition will run until the end of 2025.

Works about Kyneton

A number of works to improve the amenity of Kyneton have been underway in recent weeks:

Kyneton pram crossings Several pram crossings – sloped sections of a footpath that connect the path to the road, allowing easier movement across streets for prams, wheelchairs, and mobility aids are being upgraded, to

improve safety and accessibility.

Nine locations were identified for these upgrades, prioritised based on a location not being compliant with relevant standards; high pedestrian traffic and proximity to shopping and retail precincts, medical centres, aged care centres or schools; and requests received from the public. These works are on track to be completed by the end of June.

Ebden Street footpath works: Works being undertaken at Ebden St are among a suite of asphalt footpath renewal works flagged for completion in the 2024-25 financial year.

These works focus on replacing and/or upgrading existing footpaths or shared paths, to improve safety and accessibility.

Works near Visitor Information Centre Council replaced two ageing flagpoles near the Kyneton Visitor Information Centre, to ensure that we can continue to fly selected flags as appropriate.

The intersection of Batters Lane and Pipers Creek Road on the outskirts of Kyneton has been earmarked for a suite of road safety upgrades, prioritised for its history of crashes and high westbound traffic.

These works, set to begin this week (w/c 16 June) and be completed by the end of June (weather permitting), include installing an electronic flashing 'Give Way Ahead' sign; a traffic island; clearer lane lines and reflective markers; vegetation trimming; and improved street lighting. This project is funded through the Federal Government's Black Spot Program, which aims to improve road safety and help prevent serious injuries and deaths on our roads.

Temporary traffic management measures will be in place during these works - visit mrsc.vic.gov.au/Batters-Lane for more info.

Asphalt renewal program: Under this recurring program of works, existing road surfaces are renewed with new asphalt. Several locations across the Shire have been prioritised for renewal, including two sections of Edgcombe St - from High Street to the roundabout at Epping Street, and from the raised platform in front of Kyneton Primary School to Sturt St.

Intersection Plan modified

Following significant concerns from the community about the draft plan to improve the safety of the Mollison St-Beauchamp St intersection the Macedon Ranges Shire Council has prepared a new modified draft.

The new plan has removed the outstands on the western side of the intersection which if adopted should allow improved traffic flow as vehicles heading North along Mollison St will be able to pass on the inside of vehicles seeking to turn right into Beauchamp from Mollison St.

The pedestrian crossing of Beauchamp St east of the intersection has been retained.

Through its new 40kph speed limit proposals the Council appears to be seeking to reduce the speed limit along Mollison St through the intersection from 60 kph to 40kph.

Founded in 1895, the Metcalfe CFA brigade currently has 54 members, which includes 17 women.

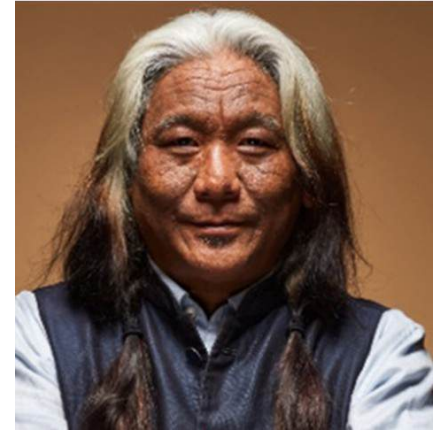
The new station is located at 22 Kyneton-Metcalfe Road with construction being undertaken by H.Troon Pty Ltd.
