Kyneton Law Court re-opens



The historic Kyneton Law Court resumed sitting on Mon Oct 15 after important building upgrades that have made it a safer more secure court. Attorney-General Martin Pakula and Member for Macedon Mary-Anne Thomas re-opened the heritage Court on Fri Oct 12 following the completion of a \$2M redevelopment.

The court includes a new safe interview room, separate waiting spaces and a visual separation barrier in the courtroom to improve the safety of people attending court, especially victims of family violence. Three new security officers will be present on sitting days to provide entry screening and a roving security presence, and escort for vulnerable people if required.

A new secure connection between the Kyneton police station and the courthouse will ensure the safer movement of people in custody. Building works began in October 2017, with hearings moved to Castlemaine during construction. Kyneton Law Court held more than 2800 hearings in 2016-17 and finalised almost 300 family violence intervention order matters.

The Kyneton courthouse is the earliest surviving courthouse in Victoria established after its separation from New South Wales in 1851.

"This is the first major redevelopment of this historic courthouse since Ned Kelly was here as a teenager" Member for Macedon Mary-Anne Thomas said.

The works deliver on Recommendation 182 of the Royal Commission into Family Violence by better supporting victim survivors of family violence in rural, regional and remote communities.

Medical Centre to close

After serving the Kyneton community for 29 years Coliban Medical Centre will close at the end of this month.

Although there has been some interest, Centre owners Dr John Turner and Jackie Turner have been unable to find a new GP to take over the practice which has just under 3000 patients on its books.

Dr Turner will continue to work three sessions a week at Kyneton Bupa and Jackie will handle file transfer inquiries until the end of December.



Kyneton RSL 100 Years

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the establishment of the Kyneton RSL Sub-branch in April 1918 by Kyneton residents returning from service overseas in the Great War.

To commemorate this significant milestone an anniversary dinner is being held in the Kyneton Town Hall on Friday October 26 at 6:30 for 7pm. The initial clubrooms were established in a leased property, which is now derelict and called "Caroline Chisholm House" situated in Mollison St.

In the 1920's after a short recess, the RSL moved to rooms leased in the Mechanics Institute until 1948 when they leased the Drill Hall in Market St after finding rental of the Mechanics

too expensive.

Finally the RSL members purchased a house and land at 37-39 Mollison St and which, after several refurbishments and improvements remains the centre of Kyneton RSL's commercial, welfare, leisure and entertainment facilities for members today.

2018 also marks the centenary of the Armistice at 11.00 AM on 11/11/1918 and the RSL is facilitating a service at the Cenotaph in the Mechanics Precinct to commemorate this event and to honour and remember all those that have fallen in war. In conjunction with the service 222 white crosses together with poppies representing the fallen listed on the Cenotaph will be arranged on the lawn adjacent to the Cenotaph.

Please consider taking the time to nominate and help us acknowledge someone or a group for their achievement or event.

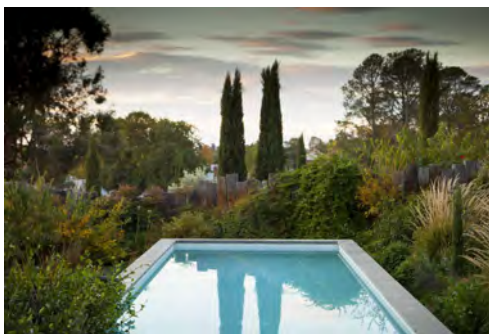

Creations by leading garden designers will be on show in the Macedon Ranges on November 10 and 11 as part of the biennial Garden DesignFest. A rambling mature garden surrounding a 19th century bluestone cottage in Malmsbury will contrast with a 12-month-old modern 'Aperture Garden' in Kyneton.

The Deborah Hambleton designed garden at "Melrose" at 33 Clowes Street, Malmsbury, surrounds a circa 1860s bluestone cottage.

The contrasting 'Aperture Garden' at 2/79 Wedge St is a bold example of how landscape architectural design principles can be successfully applied to residential spaces.

Honoured at the Cemetery

A special ceremony to honour Gretta Lyons was held at Kyneton Cemetery on Friday Oct 12 to remember her tireless work towards the establishment of the Australian Nursing Federation.

Gretta was interred at the Cemetery in 1923 shortly before her long-held dream was fulfilled with the foundation of the Nurses Federation in 1924.

Margaret Anne Lyons, known as Gretta, was born in 1869 in Kyneton and trained as a general nurse at the Alfred Hospital. She proceeded through many nursing roles to become Matron at Williamstown Hospital and later owned a private hospital.

Gretta was active in advocating for improved health of mothers and babies. She also advocated for nurses who she knew to be exploited by some employers. She was a lone voice for ordinary nurses' conditions of employment to be improved.

Gretta was a foundation member of the Royal Victorian Trained Nurses Association established in 1901, but when the RVTNA executive failed to support her quest to improve nurses' conditions, Gretta took matters into her own hands.

In 1921, with two colleagues, she established the Trained Nurses Guild as an industrial organisation, registering it with the Federal Court of Arbitration. This was a forerunner of the Australian Nursing Federation formed to deal with nursing's 'industrial' issues.

The ceremony was conducted by Pru Cox President of the Alfred Hospital Nurses League and Elizabeth Foley, Federal Professional Officer of the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Federation (formerly the ANF) and was attended by Cr Janet Pearce, herself a nurse, Cr Bill West, and a number of Association members.

Fr Declan O'Brien conducted the Blessing and Dedication of Gretta's Grave and Plaque.



Men's Shed opened

The new Kyneton Men's Shed was opened on Oct 10 by the Victorian Minister for Families and Children, Jenny Mikakos and local State Member Mary-Anne Thomas.

The new Shed is located at 2 Riverwalk Boulevard adjacent to Bupa. It includes a massive workshop, kitchen, meeting room, library and computer room, an office and is almost twice the size of the old shed.

Ms Mikakos congratulated the KMS members and the key sponsors of the Shed, including Bupa Aged Care and the Victorian government.

She said that they had all contributed to make the new Shed one of the best in Victoria. Local merino wool producer, Noel Henderson playing a special role. He not only provided \$10,000, but used his vast experience in the building industry to oversee the Shed's construction.

Shed Chair, John Mitchell, said the new Shed represented a more than half a million dollar investment in Kyneton.

"The Shed members are also to be congratulated for the way they have supported the Shed's executive committee during the tough three years we had before being offered a lifeline by Bupa," he said. "While it was disappointing we were not able to find land during that time, we thank Graham Hackett for putting us in touch with Bupa so we were able to form a special partnership to make this new Shed a reality."

A highlight of the day was the unveiling of a new sign to mark the Shed, and three smaller signs to mark the Bob Grubb Workshop, the Noel Henderson Meeting Room, and the Brian Ward Office.

"The Shed applauds all 3 men for the way in which they have contributed to the Shed," Mr. Mitchell said.

The new Shed is currently open Wednesday to Friday 10am-3pm. The Shed is considering opening one night a week and a Saturday and/or a Sunday so that men who work during the week can have access to the Shed.

Aboriginal Art Unveiled

Kyneton District Health revealed its new Aboriginal art at an Official Unveiling Ceremony on Thu Oct 4.

The transparent artwork, designed by Taungurung artist Maddi Moser, sits on interior windows in the main entrance of the hospital.

The piece recognises Taungurung's relationship with waterways, the land, and the manner in which time continues those connections, despite aspects of country changing.

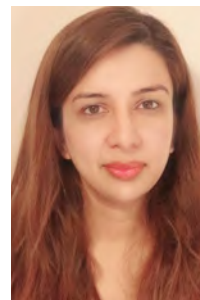

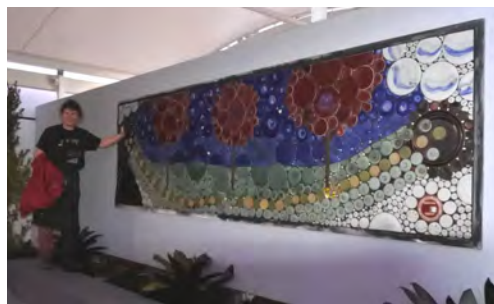

Unsealed road causes angst

Residents who live along the 800m unsealed section of Batters Lane are continuing their quest to have their section of the Lane sealed.

Some years ago most of the Lane was sealed with residents of that section contributing a small proportion of the cost.

Batters Lane is a significant through road used by residents beyond the Lane going to and from the Freeway and by golfers.

Residents have reported that they have to have their tanks cleaned out every year because of the dust from the road but that they have been told that they will have to contribute \$90,000 between them to have the road sealed.

Resident Trish Harris said that current Council policy is that if through traffic on a road is more than 76%, residents should not be required to make any contribution to sealing it.

She said that a recent count of traffic along the unsealed road has shown the volume of through traffic was more than 82%.

The Council currently does not have a funded capital works program to upgrade unsealed roads in the Shire.

"The only projects for the sealing of an unsealed road that have been approved by Council in the past 15 years have a percentage of contribution from benefiting property owners through a special charge scheme" Council's Director of Assets and Operations Dale Thornton told *Kyneton Connect*.
