Watts Fresh is open

The Lambs have been delighted with the reaction to their spacious new store and the large number of customers who came through in just the first few days.

The spacious new premises offers much more than a very wide range of quality fruit and vegetables.

It now houses a delicatessen, a fresh juice bar, coffee, tea and snacks and comfortable tables at which to consume them.

The new Watts Fresh has added bulk cereal and nuts to their offerings and continues to stock flowers and seedlings.

The new Watts Fresh even has its own toilets including a baby change room and it has on-site parking.

Flynn Silver to the fore

Locals John and Dan Flynn of Flynn Silver were honoured to be commissioned to make the Presidents Cup for the American Professional Golf Association to be played at Royal Melbourne early December.

The event will be broadcast into just over 1 billion households, in 226 countries and territories.

Tiger Woods and Ernie Els are Captaining the respective US and International teams



This is the first time the cup has been made outside the US and provided many challenges in its creation.

Flynn Silver for over 70 years based in Kyneton, has been commissioned to design and create many important trophies including the Formula One Grand Prix trophy, but consider this to be the highest profile commission yet and did appreciate the comment from the American PGA" that the only two firms they would use for important works are Tiffany's in New York or Flynn's in Australia"

The impressive cup stands 540mm high is made of 22ct gold, pure silver, Britannia metal and solid brass. Hand fabricated by a few leading craftsmen, using their specialist skills it also involved many hours of detailed engraving, by a Bendigo firm, to replicate the detailed world map. Locals including Vereker Brothers and David Emery were instrumental in creating and finishing the timber base. Another world class local, Simon Griffiths shot the photograph for this report.

In Simpson and Baynton Sts

Remembrance Day

At 11am on 11 November 1918 the guns on the Western Front in Europe fell silent after more than four years continuous warfare. The 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month attained a special significance in the post-war years. The moment when hostilities ceased on the Western Front became universally associated with the remembrance of those who had died in the war.

For Australia, as for many nations, the First World War remains the most costly conflict in terms of deaths and casualties. From a population of fewer than five million, 416,809 men enlisted, of whom over 60,000 were killed and 156,000 wounded, gassed or taken prisoner.

Kyneton RSL Sub-Branch will conduct a short ceremony of remembrance at the Cenotaph in Mollison St on Nov

11, commencing at 10.40am.

A minute's silence will be held at 11am.

There will be a formal wreath-laying ceremony after which members of the public are invited to lay their wreaths or floral tributes. Local schoolchildren will be involved in the service, participating in the readings and leading the public in the singing of the national anthem.

After the ceremony, refreshments will be served at the RSL. All are invited to attend.

I can't let the opportunity pass to congratulate the committee, volunteers, sponsors and supporters on another diverse and successful Kyneton Daffodil and Arts Festival. I was very happy to be asked to officially open the event and art exhibition (so pleasing to see the increase in youth entries). I certainly enjoyed judging the Grand Parade with Brett Lefebvre and it wouldn't be a parade without the experience and long time Master of Ceremonies (MC) Arnold Jenkins announcing the 77 entries as they passed the Town Hall.

Council continues to move forward looking at innovative ways to work with the community to address the waste and recycling issue, with a big focus on separating glass and also the Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) to be phased in early next year. Councillors have also been involved with staff completing a bin audit and also a visit to a Paper Processing Factory. Thank you for all your support.

The Kyneton Airfield Master Plan received many submissions and these will all be made available to all Councillors to read. The plan is that it will come to an Ordinary Council Meeting this year.

I have attended many interesting regional meetings, forums and conferences over the last months. These have included the Towards Zero Regional Safety Forum which will contribute to the Road Safety and Action Plan being developed looking at- Safe roads, Safe speeds, Safe vehicles and Safe people and aiming toward zero fatalities and injuries.

Also the Victorian Government Rating Consultation which is a full review being carried out by an independent three-person panel. This is to identify changes that will improve it's fairness and equity and ensure that the burden

of rates falls fairly amongst all ratepayers. The process should be completed by March 2020.

Others I attended included the review of the Regional Tourism Board Review, The Victorian Planning Authority Forum- Futures thinking: Shaping Regional Victoria, the Wellbeing in Every Decision: Planning for a Healthy and Liveable region Conference, the review of the Local Government Act, the Greenhouse Alliance Conference and I will soon attend the National Local Government Mental Health Forum. These are all important issues affecting our Shire.

As I write this, Macedon Ranges is preparing to host the Australia Local Government Women's Association Annual Victorian Conference which is a weekend event. We have a great array of speakers and are proud to be given the opportunity to highlight our unique Shire to other Councils and organisations.

Removing glass from recycling

The Macedon Ranges Shire Council has thanked community members who have already separated glass from their recycling and are assisting Council in finding a solution to the current recycling crisis.

The Council has identified a recycling company which will process the Shire's recycling going forward as long as glass is removed and the other recyclables are not contaminated.

Shards and small pieces of glass can become embedded in paper and cardboard in recycling bins and contaminate the other recyclables.

Public place glass recycling skip bins will be installed in locations around the shire in coming weeks to assist residents in removing glass from recycling bins.

Residents can also drop off glass free of charge to Council's transfer stations in Kyneton, Woodend and Romsey for recycling. As a last resort, glass can be placed in general rubbish bins.

Council will meet in late October to consider long-term options for recycling, including the possible introduction of an additional 'glass-only' bin for the whole shire.

Wastewater and Campaspe

Coliban Water has announced Phase One works to improve the trade waste and domestic treatment processes at the Kyneton Water Reclamation Plant to help protect the Campaspe River.

Coliban Water Project Director Tony Kelly said "Our plant has struggled to store the treated water it produces when there isn't a demand for irrigation water or sufficient flows to release water to the Campaspe River. "As part of the Phase One works we will be installing additional aerators in our lagoons to enable oxygen to circulate and increase the treatment capacity.



"We are pleased to have come to an agreement with Hardwick Meatworks." "Hardwick's is working with Coliban Water and investing in multiple initiatives to assist in improving plant performance" Mr Kelly said.

The initiatives include improving the quality of the wastewater Hardwicks sends to the plant for treatment, creating additional storage capacity and onsite irrigation with Class B treated water.

Phase One of Coliban's works are expected to be completed in March 2020. Phase Two and Three of the works will include additional storage lagoons and increased irrigation.

Mr Kelly said when all phases are complete the plant will operate within its EPA licence conditions and meet future residential and business growth in the region.

Local landowner Huntly Barton has welcomed the news that new aerators will be installed into the first of the C grade ponds.

Mr Barton said that landholders had told Coliban Water that the local community will not accept release of class C water into the Campaspe any longer and that a petition has been started seeking an upgrade of the facility so it produces nothing less than B class water.

Huntly Barton is concerned that the proposed works will be a short term fix only.

He said "In two or three years' time we most likely will be back to where we are now."

The Preloved Pedlar Op Shop held its AGM recently and were able to report that once again the year was very successful.

Successful - in that they were able to assist people in our local community who were suffering short term hardship or in immediate need.

People in the Kyneton area have been most supportive in the way they have given goods to the shop and also by purchasing 'pre-loved' items.

Without this generosity of donating clothes, furniture and electrical goods the Op Shop would have nothing to sell in the shop and therefore nothing to redistribute.

Requests for assistance are made in various ways, through Cobaw, local schools, service clubs, churches and from individuals.

This reflects the ongoing need for strong community support in towns such as Kyneton.

Many requests are for clothing items and household goods. These are given from what is in the shop and shed. Requests for food come from the Pedlar's pantry and freezer which is stocked using the money collected from shop purchases.

The money raised through selling items in the shop also enables the Pre-loved Pedlar to deal with emergency events such as power bills, medical expenses and assistance with short term accommodation.

Annually, the organisation contributes to local services at Christmas time providing gifts and hampers. Across the last financial year the Preloved Pedlar has given \$17,580 for these purposes.

The Preloved Pedlar is a social gathering place and we have many regular customers who come in to browse and have a chat.

The shop is run exclusively by volunteers who give willingly and cheerfully of their time.

The work on the day is varied from serving in the shop to sorting and ironing items in the workroom at the back of the premises.

Friends of Black Hill 40 Years



To celebrate the 40 year Anniversary of the Friends of Black Hill group, an event will be held at the Reserve on Sun Nov 24 at 11am where the traditional owners of the land, the Taungurung will welcome you to country with a smoking ceremony, there will be historical displays, information about the reserve, food, walks, talks and activities for the young and the young at heart.

Black Hill Nature Reserve, 9km north of Kyneton, once home to the Taungurung people, features granite outcrops amid basalt plains. The natural bush land is now home to many species of flora and fauna and provides a haven for people to enjoy passive recreation.

It hasn't always been so. Since the mid 1800's, early European settlers identified the area as a rich resource for timber and gravel to supply the growing township of Kyneton. By the mid 1950's, the area was in a poor state of degeneration, the northern slopes denuded of timber.

In 1964 the Kyneton Shire Council commenced work to remedy the degradation by planting around 15,000 native trees in the worst affected areas, and increased the reserve to 260 acres by purchasing adjoining land. The Shire President of the time, Carl Nielsen was instrumental in driving forward the vision of the preservation and regeneration of the Reserve.

The 'Friends of Black Hill' group of volunteers was formed in 1979

Since then, the Friends group has been responsible for much of the management of the Reserve including weed eradication, planting many thousands of trees and understory plants, creating walking tracks, many hundreds of steps and drains to counter erosion.

Picnic tables, the Rotunda and Information Boards, a directional plaque together with walking track signs have been erected. Close to 80

nesting boxes have been installed throughout the reserve to provide lodgings for Black Hill's wide variety of fauna that calls Black Hill home.

The Friends Of Black Hill these days comprise a motivated group of local volunteers and their families, old and young.

Meetings and working bees are held throughout the year.

The Friends current project is the refurbishment of the rotunda to include 4 up-to-date information panels.

The Friends group is grateful for the support of the Macedon Ranges Shire Council's Environmental department for advice, flora and fauna monitoring and the current rebuilding of the steepest part of the ridge track which following the 2015 fire (which devastated 80% of the reserve) and subsequent rains which washed away the topsoil and resulted in severe erosion.

As a result, part of the ridge track is currently closed whilst these essential works are completed.

The Friends of Black Hill invite local residents and others to join them on Nov 24 for their celebration and to thank the founding members of the Friends group for their vision, dedication and hard work, and the volunteer members who have given freely of their time and labour over the past 40 years.
